
THE FUNDAMENTAL 5

The FORMULA for Quality Instruction

The Fundamental Five are five critical practices that are at the core of highly effective instruction. These practices are:

- 1. Framing the Lesson– A lesson frame represents the beginning and end of a lesson.
- 2. Working in the Power Zone– Teaching or monitoring in close proximity to one student, or a small group of students, or the entire classroom full of students.
- 3. FSGPT– Frequent, small-group, purposeful talk about the learning.
- 4. Recognize and Reinforce– Recognition and reinforcement of behaviors and academics create classroom environments that are nurturing, engaging, and empowering.
- 5. Writing Critically– Writing for a purpose of organizing, clarifying, defending, refuting,
